Mission: The Board of Certification for Emergency Nursing (BCEN®) supports nurses to achieve excellence by being the industry leader in professional credentialing while promoting the value of certification and lifelong learning.

Vision: Every patient across the emergency spectrum receives care from a BCEN-certified nurse.

About BCEN

Emergency nurses—whether they work in emergency, transport or trauma care—must be at the peak of caregiving excellence. **Board certification** is a professionally recognized **achievement** and sought-after **mark of excellence** that validates specialty knowledge and clinical expertise that empowers nurses to positively **impact** patient care, safety and outcomes.

Founded in 1980, the **Board of Certification for Emergency Nursing (BCEN)** is an independent, not-for-profit organization that develops national board certification programs for adult/mixed and pediatric emergency, flight and critical care ground transport, and trauma nurses.

Board certification in emergency, trauma and transport nursing:

- Validates nurses have met **national standards of excellence** in their specialty, ensures ongoing competency, and equips nurses to help their units run safely, efficiently and productively.
- Affirms nurses are the best they can be, **distinguishing them** among their peers and **positioning them for maximum career success**.
- Delivers a **constant, proven and critical confidence boost** as nurses work in health care's most uncertain, demanding and dynamic environment.
- **Assures patients and their families** that nurses possess a high level of clinical expertise, are on top of best practices, and well-prepared to provide the highest quality care.

The CEN®, CFRN®, CPEN®, and TCRN® certification programs are *nationally accredited* by the Accreditation Board for Specialty Nursing Certification (ABSNC). All of BCEN's certification programs, including the CTRN®, are ANCC Magnet® Recognition Program-accepted. As of January 2023, **approximately 59,000 RNs** practicing in **26 countries** hold one or more BCEN credential.

BCEN is dedicated to supporting nurses at every stage of their careers as well as nurse educators, leaders, and administrators committed to building a specialty certified emergency nursing workforce.

BCEN's **award-winning** CE and professional development platform, launched in fall 2020, features interactive advanced CE courses, free CE webinars, full-length practice exams and the "BCEN & Friends" podcast.

Since 2022, BCEN's twice-a-year [BCEN Learn Live conferences](#) feature TED talk-style clinical and leadership CE sessions specifically designed for certified emergency, trauma and transport nurses, plus the chance to be recognized, network with other certified nurses, and recharge with self-care activities.

Research Firsts

In 2022, BCEN conducted the **first value of certification research with flight and critical care ground transport nurses**. *Read the current and upcoming findings of the [CTRN and CFRN Pulse Surveys](#).*

In 2019, BCEN initiated a research partnership with emergency, trauma and transport industry organizations to conduct the **first major nursing workforce study spanning the emergency, trauma and transport specialties**. *Read the peer-reviewed findings of [the Emergency/Trauma/Transport Nursing Workforce Survey](#).*

In September 2017, BCEN released the results of the rigorous large-scale study, the [Value of CEN® Certification Research Study](#). Reflecting the responses of over 8,800 certified and non-certified emergency nurses and 1,002 of their supervisors, this **first-of-its-kind emergency nursing value of certification study** demonstrates significant positive correlations between the CEN emergency nursing certification and multiple nursing expertise, performance and career outcomes.
